What is An Cuan Regional Support Service?

An Cuan is a HSE funded regional outreach support service which supports adults with a mild to profound Intellectual Disability (with/out a diagnosis on the Autism Spectrum) who are in receipt of services from voluntary / non-profit; for-profit and HSE registered services in Cork and Kerry.

An Cuan is an inter-disciplinary service comprising Psychology, Social Work, Occupational Therapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Positive Behaviour Support, Nursing and Social Care practitioners. Please see the 'Introduction to An Cuan' leaflet for an overview of the work An Cuan typically does.

Learning and development individualised to your needs

An Cuan provides training with a strong focus on national and international theory and practice applied to the daily experiences and learning needs of staff and families.

The aim of training is to empower families and staff to support the person to the best of their capacity. The needs of the person being supported is also placed at the centre of any training delivered. Training can be delivered in person or remotely and is currently guided by Covid-19 restrictions.

Core topic: Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

Goal: Understand the core concepts of PBS, recognise the key steps in PBS and apply to your practice.

Audience: Anyone working in the field, also families.

Duration: 4hrs **Cost:** none.

Core topic: Person Centred Planning (PCP)

Goal: Understand the core concepts of PCP, recognise the key steps in PCP and apply to your practice.

Audience: Anyone working in the field, also families.

Duration: 2hrs **Cost:** none.

Core topic: Autism Spectrum

Goal: Understand the core concepts in Autism, recognise characteristics of Autism, explore supportive approaches and apply to your practice. **Audience:** Anyone working in the field, also families.

Duration: 2hrs. **Cost:** none.

Supplementary topic: CPI Management of Actual and Potential Aggression (MAPA) foundation course

Goal: Learn how to identify behaviour, assess the level of risk, use suitable and acceptable physical interventions, and identify the impact of crisis events.

Audience: Anyone working in field.

Duration: 2 day workshop / 1 day refresher workshop **Cost:** Price for booklet and certification from CPI will be confirmed upon booking.

Supplementary topic: Positive Risk Assessment (PRA)

Goal: Understand principles of PRA, apply principles to your practice, prepare a sample risk assessment.

Audience: Anyone working in field.

Duration: 2hrs. **Cost:** none.


